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1. Installation Process

All DigitalvB FREE, Premium and Custom Projects have same image folder structure so if you are familiar with our styles, this process should be fairly straight forward

1.1 Uploading the Images to Forum

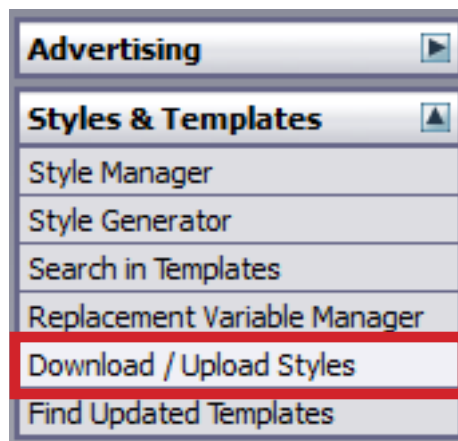
From your Style Package, copy the '**digitalvb**' folder inside '**upload**'. Use your FTP Client to upload the 'digitalvb' folder to your forum root.
